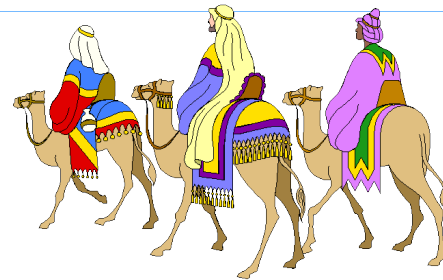

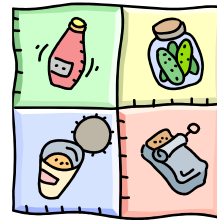

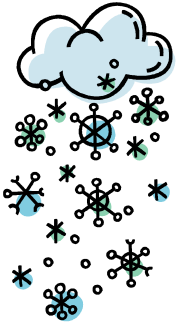
## Pillow Cases Needed
